Where can you access books?

- Support your local bookshop (e.g. The Children's Bookshop, Beecroft, Sydney)
- Check for discounts at your local bookshop, and larger department and variety stores. Big W, ALDI and K
 Mart often have cheaper books.
- Borrow books for free from your local library. Use their online catalogue to search for particular books.
 Some libraries have online storytime. (e.g. Mrs Mac at Wodonga Library and Lee at Blacktown Libraries)

Online purchasing:

Books online can be cheaper, just check postage. Use online sites like Booko where you can compare prices and get free shipping. Some have a used book option. http://booko.com.au

- Australian sites: Booktopia, Boomerang books, Story Mama, The Little Bookroom, The Little Big Book Club and many more.
- International sites: Book Depository, Amazon..
- Search Ebay for children's picture books, Gumtree have a few if you search under children's books.
- Storybox Library is a subscription service with well-known Australians reading quality children's books.
- Most book publishers have sites.
- Aboriginal books- MAGABALA, Dreamtime Kullilla Art. http://www.kullillaart.com.au
- Aboriginal and multicultural: Global Kids OZ, Global Language Books, and Go Fair Trading.
- Bookfairs, garage sales and markets have amazing bargains.
- Your local Australia Post office- often has cheap book packs from well-known Australian authors.
- Find books in the Scholastic Book Club flier in your early education centre or school. Scholastic regularly have large sales in the Sydney area.
